WHAT DOES PERM ENTAIL?

PERM ["Program Electronic Review Management"] relating to permanent labor certifications, to be effective on March 28, 2005, has the following salient features:

It will require the filing of a newly developed Application for Permanent Employment Certification [Form ETA 9089].

The State Workforce Agencies ["SWA"s] will be involved only as relates to determination of the prevailing wage for the job offered at a specific location within the state.

Labor certification applications will be filed directly with the U.S. Department of Labor.
