Outlook for Employment-Based Visa Numbers

Department of State has recently commented on the outlook for employment-based visa numbers as follows:

"Worldwide: Based on the current level of number use in the Employment First and Second preference categories there will be no need to impose a cut-off date for the categories. While the First preference number use is relatively close to my target, the Second preference is significantly below my target, which doesn't make a lot of sense.

China and India: The same lack of demand comments apply to these First and Second preference cutoffs. This has resulted in the rapid advancement of the China and India cut-offs, which I expect to continue for the next several months.

China Third - Should stay at the Worldwide date.

India Third - This cut-off should continue to move, but such movement may become more limited. "
