VAWA 2005 CLEARED

The Senate and the House have cleared for the President's signature the Violence Against Women Reauthorization Act of 2005 (VAWA 2005). The VAWA provisions were contained in the Department of Justice Appropriations Authorization Act for Fiscal Years 2006-2009, amended and passed by the Senate on December 16, and cleared by the House on December 17. The President is expected to sign the legislation.

The final bill does not include the amendment that would have prohibited any person convicted of domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking, trafficking, elder abuse, or dating violence from sponsoring a visa applicant in the future.
