# MANDAMUS ISSUED AGAINST US CONSUL IN MOSCOW

In an employment-based immigrant visa case that was pending with the U. S. Consular Section in Moscow for 4 years, the U.S. District Court in San Diego has recently issued a writ of mandamus against the consular officers ordering them to issue a decision in the case within 60 days.

The district court has, of course, no jurisdiction to mandate a consular officer to approve the case but it has the jurisdiction to force the consulate to issue the decision one way or the other... either grant or deny the case rather than sit on it for years without taking action.

The complaint was filed on May 14, 2004 by RADUGA USA CORP against U S DEPT OF STATE, COLIN POWELL, U S consular officers in Moscow, and others. The case was submitted after status hearing on February 25, 2005 and the order of the Court was entered on May 24, 2005.
