AFFIDAVIT OF SUPPORT REQUIREMENTS EASED

Effective immediately, sponsors filing an Affidavit of Support [Form I-864] are required to submit only their Federal tax return for their most recent tax year, current as of the date of execution of the I-864. [Three years' tax returns are no longer required]. The I-864 will remain valid indefinitely absent other evidence of failure to meet the public charge provisions of the law. For "public charge" determination, the poverty guidelines in effect on the date of filing with the National Visa Center or with the U. S. consular post will be looked at.

Updated tax returns will not be requested absent positive evidence of public charge issues.

The sponsor's signature on Form I-864 does not need to be notarized anymore. Photocopies of Form I-864 that are submitted for derivative applicants accompanying the principal alien do not require an original signature or notarization.
