FINAL RULE ON TRAVEL OF H & L NONIMMIGRANTS

H and L nonimmigrants often travel abroad after submitting an application to the USCIS on Form I-485 for adjustment of status. Until now, they were required to present at port of entry, while returning to the United States, an I-485 receipt notice. If they could not, their application for adjustment was deemed to have been abandoned.

This requirement of presenting an I-485 receipt has been removed effective November 1, 2007. H & L nonimmigrants can freely travel in and out of the United States, during the validity period of their H or L status even if they have applied for adjustment of status. They neither need an advance parole authorization nor are they now required to present an I-485 receipt at port of entry.
