H1B GONE FOR THE WHOLE YEAR

A press note released late in the evening of October 1, 2004 by the Citizenship and Immigration Services has shocked the business community and the professionals aspiring to obtain H1B status.

USCIS announced, at approximately 8:00 pm on October 1, 2004, the first day of fiscal year 2005, that it has enough H-1Bs in the pipeline to meet the fiscal year 2005 cap. All cap-subject cases received after the end of the business day October 1 will be returned.

What this means is that a qualified professional who aspires to obtain an H1B status will have to wait one whole

year. On October 1, **2005**, a fresh supply of H1B visa numbers will become available.
