USCIS EXPANDS PREMIUM PROCESSING SERVICE

Beginning August 28, USCIS has accepting Premium Processing requests for petitions involving two employment-based immigration "categories" within third employment-based "preference." Those categories involve EB-3 Professionals, (i.e. immigrant workers with bachelor degrees who are members of the professions), and EB-3 Skilled Workers, (i.e. immigrant workers capable of performing skilled labor requiring at least two years of education. training experience). Employers file for categories using both Immigrant Petition for Alien Worker (Form I-140). Premium Processing is not available to "other workers" in the EB-3 category for jobs that do not require two years of education, training or experience.

USCIS has released a revised Request for Premium Processing Services form (Form I-907), to include expansion of Premium Processing Service to the newly designated classifications. The new Form I-907 bears a revision date of *August 28, 2006,* with the designation "N" shown after the revision date.
